Bring 'n' Brag


Editor's note: Alden McBee was asea at the time of the June meeting, so he appointed Bob DiBenedetto to coordinate and run the model contest, Larry Willming to photograph the models, and Ned Kluth to write up the report and tally standings. Thank you all for stepping up! -P.A.

The June Bring 'n' Brag category was hopper bottom cars, and all four entries qualified.

First place went to Mike Hohn for his five HO well detailed, scratch built LVRR wood hoppers with styrene details. They are based on scale drawings of the prototype published in 1880s



Second place went to Neal Schorr for his O gauge Lackawanna cement hopper. The model is a stock Weaver hopper that, after dullcoting, was aged with white acrylic paint, matte medium, and white chalk to simulate cement spills and accumulations. Weathering was done with a combination of white Pan Pastel and Dullcote.

Neal also took third place with his O gauge PRR icicle breaker hopper. The car is a Lionel O-27 model with the addition of the I-beams that formed the icicle breaker structure used to clear

the roof of the three tunnels at the summit of the grade leading up from Altoona.

Jim Braum entered an HO Accurail centerflow hopper kit which was turned into an ex UP car for a private business' in plant use by weathering with powders plus a renumbering patch to simulate a quick reporting mark cover-up.

Minutes

Gary invited the membership to tour the facility and offered to demonstrate 3D printing after the meeting.

There were no new members, but Steve Zapytowski (Asst. Superintendent of MCR Division 1) was present as a guest.

The minutes from last month's meeting were approved.

Committee Reports

Vagel Keller was not present, so there was no Keystone Flyer report.

Treasurer Jeff Gregg reported that the division is solvent and that the Jamboree made a small amount of money.

Convention Account: Andy Blenko was not present, so no report.

Programs: Assistant Superintendent Frank Benders reminded everyone that next month's meeting in Morgantown, WV would feature Neal Schorr's presentation on the early days of the Pennsylvania Turnpike. Bring N' Brag: Bob DiBenedetto was filling in for Alden McBee. He noted that the category was "Hopper Bottom Cars," reported 4 entries had been made, and urged everyone to vote.

The meeting adjourned at 2:57 PM.



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

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
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Shop Tour at Portland Locomotive Works

Following our June luncheon and meeting at the Old Greenford School building in Salem, Ohio, the members present were treated to a tour of the Portland Locomotive Works by its CEO Gary Kohler. Gary's shop is located in one of the spaces on site at this former school building, which now is a community business incubator.

Gary was kind enough to open his factory to us and also to introduce us to PLM's design processes and laser cutting and 3D printing equipment. His laser cutters and 3D printer are connected to a computer workstation in the office, and it is in this compact room where the designs are transformed into wooden and resin parts to build up beautifully detailed structures and rolling stock kits for his customers' railroads.


When asked whether PLM uses any detail parts from third parties (e.g. door/window castings), Gary responded "No, we produce all detail parts here so that we are not dependent on third party vendors who may not be there tomorrow." He demonstrated to us how his Form-



Labs 3D printer was producing a structure detail for a building kit (see photo at left).

A good portion of the work that is done here is done on commission basis. One of his employees showed us two round-houses under construction for clients. I was particularly struck by the wood-/coal-fired shop heaters, complete with the glow from the fire raging inside (the secret: they mounted a pulsing red LED in the floor beneath the heater, which was 3D printed with clear resin and then

painted black, except for the "door area" in front, which allows the 'flames' to remain visible).

Gary is designing and building structures for the discriminating modeler, and as noted in the minutes above, PLM is producing four structure kits for Division 2 to use as a fundraiser for the MCR regional convention we are hosting in Pittsburgh's Greentree suburb in 2020.

This author encourages everyone to pitch in and buy one (or more, or all four!) of these nicely detailed models (pictured at right), when they become available. Besides the B&O coal/oil house that I just had to purchase that day, PLM is also producing a signal tower, a fire hose house, and a B&O telegraph office. These are based on prototype structures that are very familiar to railfans across our region, and the price points (though

not entirely set as of this writing) are competitive with other laser-cut craftsman kits.

PLM is producing 4 kits for Division 2 as a fundraiser for the MCR convention we are hosting in 2020: Pictured here are the Oscale Signal tower (above right); the kit for the HO scale Fire Hose

house with Dennis' instructions (center); the B&O telegraph office (below right); and the B&O coal/oil house (below). All photos by Patrick Altdorfer.
