





Likewise, "we" never see two railroads crossing at grade, because Pennsylvania has laws against that! They were enacted by the State Legislature over a century ago at the

Programs: Frank Benders noted that tables with the collection of Jerry Kyslinger will be at the November meeting in New Eagle. About 2/3 of the cars in the collection are already gone. A third of the buildings are sold as well. Frank announced that November's program will be about how to handle paperwork for the NMRA Achievement Program and will be presented by Susan Werner.

Company Store: Susan Werner reported that the store was open and that she has NYC boxcars, a handcar shed that can be transformed into any number of useful structures, and a bunch of City Classics stuff. Orders for a 2020 calendar are due TO-DAY! She will be delivering them at November's meeting.

Membership/Website: Tom Gaus reported that membership now stands at 229, and that the website was up to date. He is planning to redo the photo pages and insert a shortcut to Vagel's YouTube page.

Free-Mo: Pat Altdorfer reported that Free-Mo will be at the next Greenberg show in November with 6 tables – a 20'x25' layout.

Video Library: Bud Brock had no report. However, he did say that the train-related items of Kent Miller's estate will also be at the November meeting.

Bring-N-Brag: Arley Mitchell reported that there were 3 entries and 2 items for display.

Achievement Program: Dennis Vaccaro awarded one Golden Spike Award to Joel Everly, a Merit Certificate to Bud Brock (for his bridge) and another Golden Spike Award to Rob DeBenedetto.

T-Trak: Dennis announced that of the 6 tables, 5 tables will be



IRWIN MEETING AND AWARDS

At the Irwin business meeting in October, Dennis Vaccaro presented achievement awards to three or our members. Bud Brock (below) received a Merit Award toward his Master Builder—Structures certificate, for the O scale trestle he built and which was displayed at the September meeting in Steubenville and featured as October's Model of the Month. And two Golden Spike awards were presented to Bob DeBenedetto (right, above) and Joel Everly (right, below), for their home layouts. (A propos the NMRA Achievement Program, Susan Werner is presenting a program this month



at the New Eagle meeting regarding paperwork management for the AP awards.)

After the meeting Andy Blenko presented a program on British Railways' IC 125 HST, its high speed passenger service (details overleaf).





IC 125 HST

At the October meeting, Andy Blenko presented a program on British Railways' Inter-City 125 HST ("High-Speed Train"), a passenger train that made the speed record for a diesel locomotive at more than 125mph. This service ran 43 years, concluding service life in May of this year. After the meeting, Andy opened the Blenko layout, aka the "Pittsburgh Main Line" — a representation of the Conrail system in the 1980s between Pittsburgh and Johnstown. As a special treat, he ran his own OO scale model of the IC 125 HST — now upgraded with DCC/Sound decoder and speaker, and reproducing the sounds of the prototype's prime mover, two-tone horns, and English station announcements — over the Conrail trackage he and son Charlie and the PML crew built in his Irwin basement.




At the conclusion of his talk, after the electronic gremlins got sorted, Andy presented this short (2 minute) video about the <u>final run of IC 125 HST</u> from London-Paddington Station to Exeter St. Davids. You can watch it again by clicking this link, or search YouTube for "Last HST from Paddington."

Andy also shared this home video of his model on the layout, starting up, running the station announcements, playing the horn, and departing Pittsburgh for a sojourn over the PML. (Whether or not this plays may depend on your software or our ability to upload it to Division website....)




At the PML after the meeting, Andy also showcased the 3-D printed Pittsburgh Penn Station, which Charlie created at Penn State University. Here are a few shots of the actual building, original architectural renderings of what was then known as the "Union Station," Charlie's transformation of these into a CAD drawing for programming into the 3-D printer, and the HO scale model os Penn Station, situated on the PML layout in its approximate location— with the IC 125 HST waiting to pick up a cohort of Pittsburgh railfans who have just arrived by taxi!

Before the October meeting in Irwin, your editor had a chance to check out the "Daeremyn & Menasha Railroad" of Dave Garlik, a friend of Division Two member Charlie Hallman, and even to run a few trains across this freelanced HO scale road. Dave hired a carpenter to build his plywood benchwork, atop which he created a scenery substructure and track subroadbed out of cardboard, red rosin, and sheet insulation, in order to maintain the layout room (his whole basement) as an essentially dust-free area.
