January 21, 2024 Business Meeting

Superintendent Dennis Coglianesi called the meeting to order at 2:30PM. He thanked the D.A.R.E. club for hosting. Dave Stanton thanked everyone for coming and noted that it was a great turnout. He also mentioned that the club is for kids, and they have many new kids starting.

Pass the Hat: Jeff Gregg passed the hat.

New members or guests – (Chief Clerk’s note: Apologies for not being able to collect the last names of the many new members in attendance.) Jacob, N scale modeler; Lisa from Monroeville, brand new to model railroading, N scale modeler; Eric, 2-rail O scale; Rob Burnett, N scale modeler.

Motion to accept the minutes as published by Richie Jodon, seconded by Dennis Vaccaro; the motion passed unanimously.

Committee Reports

Keystone Flyer – Patrick Altdorfer. The deadline for submissions for the next issue of the Keystone Flyer is January 28. Pike ads are due, 10x year published in the Flyer.

Financial – Treasurer – Jeff Gregg. The division is solvent. There is enough money to cover the Jamboree expenses.

Programs – Assistant Superintendent George Pandelios. February’s meeting will be at the Weirton Area Museum, 3149 Main St, Weirton, WV; program on scenery by George Pandelios. March’s meeting will take place at the Mon Valley Railroad Historical Society, 5000 Green Bag Road, Morgantown, WV; program on cardstock building. Meeting locations have been firmed up for nearly all of 2024. We are still (and always) on the lookout for presentations at these meetings. If you’ve done or learned something new, we’d like to see that. Help in creating a presentation (slides, handouts, etc.) is available. There was a brief discussion of possibly moving the May Business meeting date from its scheduled date of May 19; it conflicts with the last day of the MCR Convention in Cleveland; no action was taken.

Company Store – Susan Werner. The last remaining City Classics kits are still available.

Membership – Ken Hanawalt. Reported by Dennis Coglianesi: Membership is at 197; 2 new; 3 late to renew. Mike Hohn noted that National does not send any reminders. The Division recruited 5 members from the Greenberg Show in early January and 1 referred by Dave Martinelli.

Website – Tom Gaus. Reported by Dennis Coglianesi: New member AP certificates will be featured on the site.

Nominating Committee - Susan Werner noted that there have been no additional candidates announced for the elections later this year. The incumbents Dennis Coglianesi (Superintendent), George Pandelios (Assistant Superintendent), and Chief Clerk (Mike DeSensi) are all running for reelection. Additional candidates will make for a better election process.

Audit Committee – Susan Werner and Mike Hohn have accepted appointments to the Audit Committee. They had not selected the

third member and Dave Martinelli volunteered. Susan and Mike will make the final decision.

Financial Oversight Committee - Dennis Coglianesi reviewed purpose of the Financial Oversight Committee to formalize Division finances by providing formal budgeting, review and approval processes. The committee will comprise the 3 elected officers (Superintendent, Assistant Superintendent, Chief Clerk) plus the Treasurer (currently Jeff Gregg) and one additional member, Andy Blenko, who handles the Convention/Jamboree transactions.

Free-Mo – Patrick Altdorfer. The HO scale Free-Mo group took part in the January Greenberg Show and fielded an interesting 20x25 layout. The group is currently exploring options for more modules to create a loop-to-loop layout to complement the current point to point arrangement.

Bring & Brag – Rick Terek. Category was Anything Goes. Third Place: Rick Montgomery, HO scale Sinclair Service Station; Second Place: Richie Jodon; N scale twin engine house; First Place: Erik Fritzberg, O scale Pullman Club car, remodeled the interior to model as close to prototype as possible, and added LED lighting and figures. Great job, everyone!

Video Library – Bud Brock. Changes are in the works.

Achievement Program – Dennis Vaccaro. Dennis announced three Merit Awards and two AP certificates: Richie Jodon for his N scale Engine House; Jimmy Braum for his HO scale 100 ton W & LE hopper; and George Pandelios for his Open Hearth Steel Mill in O scale; Ken Hanawalt was awarded AP Certificates for Chief Dispatcher and his Golden Spike (photos on page 6).

T-TRAK – Richie Jodon / Jimmy Braum. It was noted that the Greenberg Show in early January was well attended and the T-TRAK layout ran well and without incident. It was also brought up about seeking out malls and other public places for a display, not just for the holiday season.

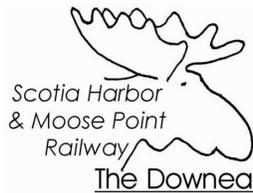

First Place went to **Erik Fritzberg** for his submission of an O scale 70 foot Pullman Club car in New York Central's 20th Century Limited livery (above). An extensive interior was added to reflect 1930s-era appointments and fixtures, including furniture, figures, and ceiling lighting.



Second Place went to **Richie Jodon** for his entry of a Twin Engine Shed in N scale (left). It was scratch-built using craft sticks, Tichy windows and doors, styrene roof sheets, and gooseneck lights. The structure was then weathered using various other materials.

Third Place went to **Rick Montgomery** for his HO scale Sinclair Service Station (right). It was built from an Atlas kit, "Al's Victory Service Station," which he changed to a Sinclair station along with signs, gasoline pumps, and the iconic dinosaur. The display includes Atlas Trucks.

Ray Helster noted that there will be a train show at the New Eagle VFD Social Hall, New Eagle, PA, next weekend, January 28.


The Division noted the passing of Bob Mehler, proprietor of Esther's Hobby in Millvale. Thoughts and prayers to his family.

Achievement Program



MEETING TIMETABLE




Four additional entries were submitted for the January contest Anything Goes.

Bryan Seip, who is active in the DARE Model RR Club, brought this wheelset load he built for operating sessions (right). He also brought prototype photos of such wheelsets being loaded on a P&LE gondola.



Jake Atkison brought a BLI N scale Mikado locomotive (#1000) and companion caboose (left) decorated for the P&WV Railway.

Jim Braum brought four HO scale No. 4 turnouts that are “works in progress,” which he is building using [Fast Tracks](#), a track-laying kit that includes an aluminum fixture for aligning and securing rails while you solder them to PC board “ties.” Next he will add wooden ties to complete the turnout and then paint the ties and rails before placement on his layout. Note: You can download templates gratis from the [company website](#) by searching “template.”



At our public Free-Mo displays, guests often ask group members what goes into the construction of our modules. Free-Mo evangelist Dave Martinelli decided to show what is “Behind the Curtain” with the new module that he and son Dominic are building (left). This module is an otherwise conventional 2 foot by

4 foot module, built to Free-Mo standards, but with half of it built over plexiglass (instead of insulation board) to reveal the lesser-known “underbelly” of the hobby: plywood construction, turnout controls, and wiring.

For display, Jim Whipple brought a vintage S scale locomotive (bottom left), essentially kit-bashed by his late friend Jack Sudimak from a tender kit plus assorted boiler detail parts from Kemtron, and scratch-built frame, cylinders, and pilot; and George Pandelios brought the January/February 2024 issue of *O Scale Trains Magazine* that



features his article on scratch-building telegraph poles (right).

Further, Esther's donated all of the Kato track necessary to complete the layout. All of the donations are in memory of the patriarch at Esther's Hobby, Bob Mehler.

I was joined by fellow Division 2 members Kevin Squire and Thomas Catalano; Jim Hofer showed up a bit late but just in time to grab some photos. We had 8 youngsters (and a couple not-so-youngsters) and their equally excited parents who showed up for the build. The kids had a great time building their own module. Glue was everywhere!! In the end, all the kids went home with a module that was assembled to specs, wired correctly, and ready for their creative efforts. Many were eager to start the scenery process even before the glue was set.
