
August Picnic Details: pages 4 and 7

Tom Catalano entered this N scale T-Trak module (diorama?) that depicts the "triple crossing" in Richmond, VA of three railroads — the C&O on the uppermost trestle, the Seaboard System on the middle bridge, above the street-running Southern Railroad. Tom recreated in this scene a prototype photo that he also brought with the module. One wonders how the mating modules look (and how many would be required to complete the scene). In any case, Tom's model placed second in the contest, which featured three other entries this month (two of which were photos, due to the subject models' immobility or prior demolition). 



Our June meeting will be held the Sunday <u>after</u> Father's Day at the Marshall Township Municipal Building (525 Pleasant Hill Road, Wexford, PA 15090). After the business meeting, Neal Schorr will present a clinic entitled "Detailing the Right of Way" after the meeting. The clinic looks at some of the details you can add to your model railroad's right of way to enhance realism and create a more interesting layout, including signage, signal bridges, relay cases, battery wells, milepost markers, cable drops, and more. The clinic includes pictures of prototype details and will show you how to create models of them.



Three local layouts will be open before and/or after the meeting: Neal's PRR Middle Division and George Pandelios' PRR Panhandle Division. Neal's home is located five minutes from the meeting site (115

Hilltop Lane, Wexford, PA 15090). Parking is available only on Vander Road, because Hilltop Lane is private and no parking is available there or in Neal's driveway. He will post signs that direct visitors to the walk down to his house. Hours are 11:30am to 1:30pm and (time permitting) after his post-meeting program. George's home is located ten minutes from the meeting site (420 Wealdstone Road, Cranberry Twp., PA 16066). His layout will be open from 11am to 1:30pm before the meeting, and (likewise time permitting) after the meeting & program ends until 6pm. The layout is in the basement (15 steps, no ADA accommodations). And Dennis Coglianese will open his HO scale Southern Pacific layout before the meeting (10am to 1:30pm). He is located about 20 minutes south of the meeting site (110 Northridge Dr, Pittsburgh, PA 15237), so right on the way for anyone coming from the southern portion of Division Two.



Volunteering: What can YOU do to help Division Two?

2024 Incentive Rewards for Recruiting New Members

For the entire year of 2024, we would like to encourage current members to seek out potential new members at train shows, hobby shops, clubs, or anywhere such candidates might be found. Division Two will reward members for any new members they recruit.

This is how the reward program will work:

- The current member tells the new member about the NMRA's RailPass program and that the division will pay for that RailPass if the following takes place:
- The new member will complete an application on the NMRA website and purchase a RailPass membership (the new member must save his/her receipt).
- The new member comes to a Division 2 meeting in one of the next 3 months that meetings are held.
- The new member is issued a check for the RailPass membership (\$19.99) when their membership is confirmed on the Division's Membership list provided by the Mid-Central Region on the first of each month and they have fulfilled the requirement to attend a Division 2 meeting. Note that if the new member enrolls in any other membership level, we will refund the cost of a RailPass membership.
- The recruiting member is issued a check for \$10.00 when the new member fulfills the requirement to attend a Division 2 meeting.

Since this Incentive Program will run for the full year, we are going to add 2 more incentives for our members.

At the end of 2024, any member who has recruited 3 or more new members who met the above requirements will receive a \$25 bonus.

At the end of 2024, any member who has recruited 5 or more new members who met the above requirements will receive a \$50 bonus.

Note, the bonuses cannot be stacked. Any member who is awarded the 5 recruits bonus will not (also) receive the 3 recruit bonus.
