From the Super's Desk

In my column last month, I congratulated the Jamboree Event team, led by Grier Kuhn and Neal Schorr, for a great job running the event.

However, our post-game review exposed some problems on the member participation side.

Attendance was down about 30% from the 2022 Jamboree. The number of models submitted for the popular vote contests was lower than usual. And the number of visitors for the layout tours was alarmingly low.

We hold the Jamboree annually so our membership has the opportunity to gather to learn new ideas, share ideas with others and demonstrate work they have done. We don't do it to raise money for the division (although we would like to cover our costs, which we always do).

We all approach our modeling differently. We all choose different prototypes, eras, locales, layout sizes. Some of us do all our modeling alone and others have a group that works on the layout. Some of us have operating sessions with varying styles, and some of us just enjoy watching their trains run.

I believe that whatever you are doing is more fun when you allow others to share what you are doing. I also believe that what you are doing is more fun when you meet with other modelers and learn something from them or from clinics.

For many years, I was a member of several model railroad clubs, but I was really a lone wolf modeler. Since I've been involved with this organization, I've met many great people and learned so many more things that have allowed me to get more enjoyment from the hobby. I have regular ops sessions with a group of modelers that are my favorite day of the month (even my wife says that!). I can firmly say that it's much more fun to participate than to do it on my own.

I accept that some of us may have had a bad experience at one of these events. There is always a chance that in any given gathering, you might encounter someone that rubs you the wrong way. We human beings are a complex bunch of personalities and emotions and we don't all behave the way we should all the time.

But know that our organization exists to provide its members with the opportunity to interact with others in a way that is beneficial to all members. Don't let a bad experience keep you from participating in our activities. We will work hard to make it fun for all members. Come and join us !

The Board of Directors and Jamboree Committee are looking for ways to improve these statistics as well as other things we can do to increase member engagement. Tear-down Crew: 3-4 folks to handle clearing up the tables, putting out the cooking fire and disposing of the ashes, picking up any stray trash, etc.

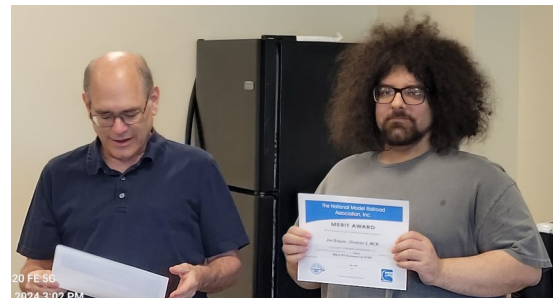

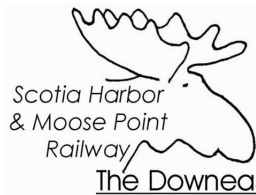
Achievement Program

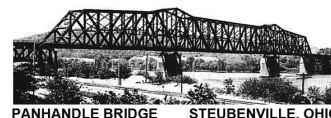

We had a three way tie for **third place!** The winners were:

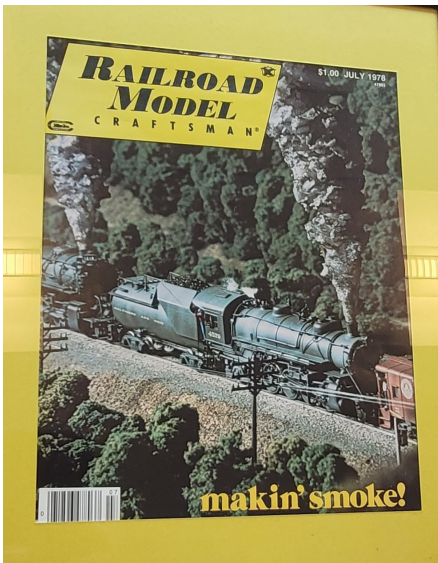

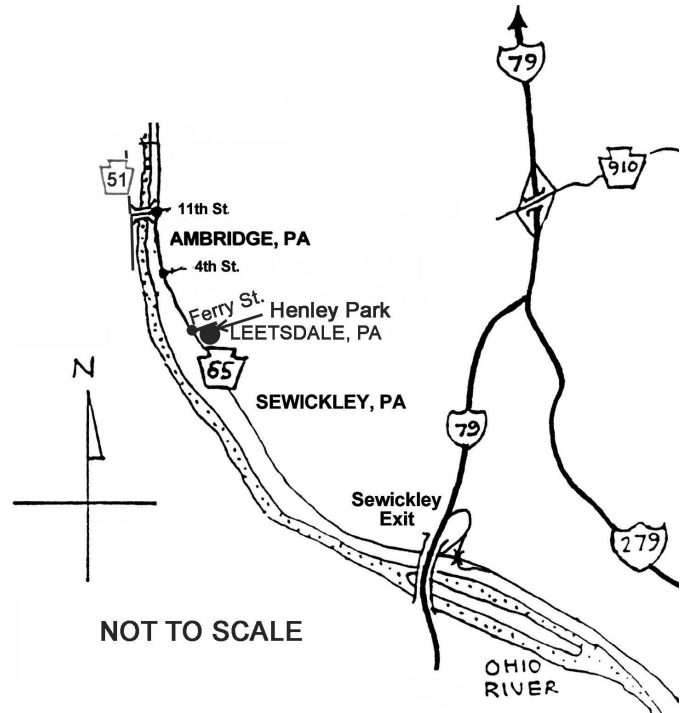

August 18: Henle Park Leetsdale, PA

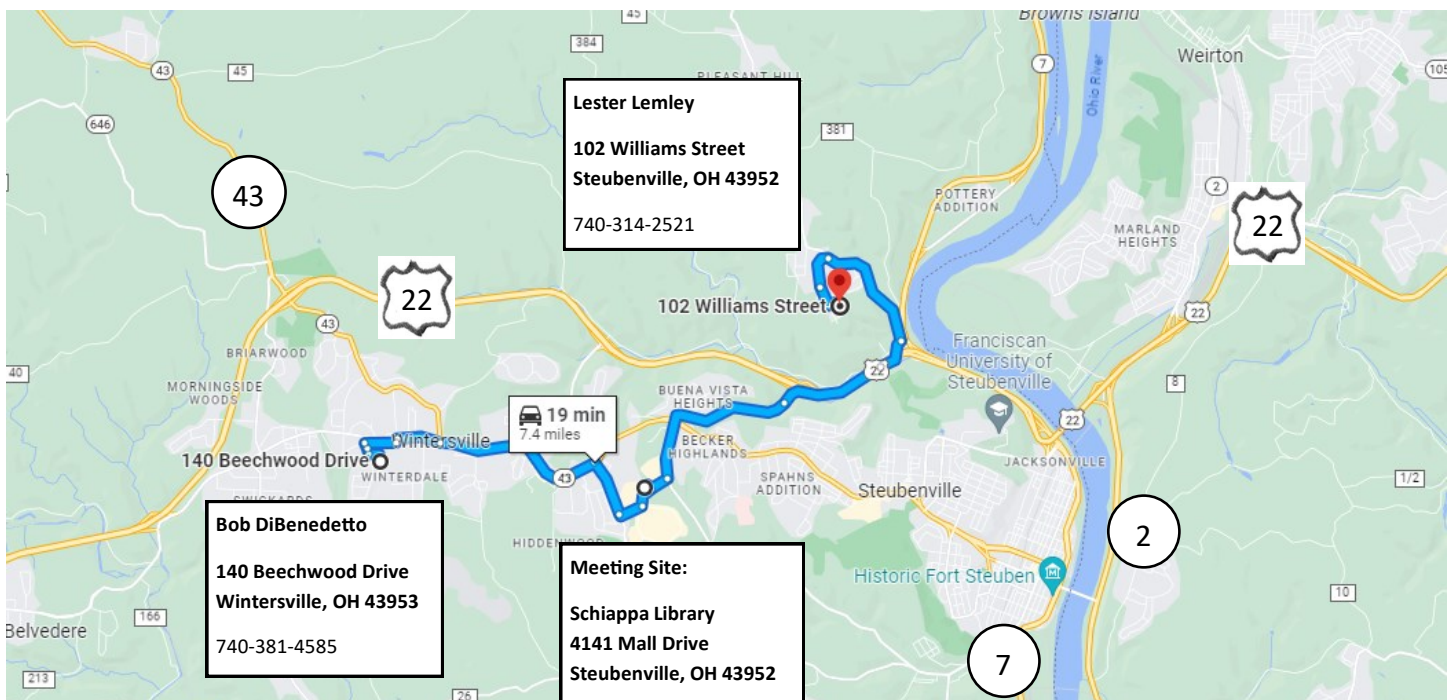

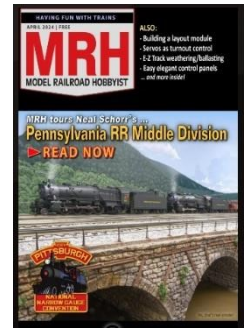

2024 Incentive Rewards for Recruiting New Members

For the entire year of 2024, we would like to encourage current members to seek out potential new members at train shows, hobby shops, clubs, or anywhere such candidates might be found. Division Two will reward members for any new members they recruit.

This is how the reward program will work:

The current member tells the new member about the NMRA's RailPass program and that the division will pay for that RailPass if the following takes place:

The new member will complete an application on the NMRA website and purchase a RailPass membership (the new member must save his/her receipt).

The new member comes to a Division 2 meeting in one of the next 3 months that meetings are held.

The new member is issued a check for the RailPass membership (\$19.99) when their membership is confirmed on the Division's Membership list provided by the Mid-Central Region on the first of each month and they have fulfilled the requirement to attend a Division 2 meeting. Note that if the new member enrolls in any other membership level, we will refund the cost of a RailPass membership.

The recruiting member is issued a check for \$10.00 when the new member fulfills the requirement to attend a Division 2 meeting.

Since this Incentive Program will run for the full year, we are going to add 2 more incentives for our members.

At the end of 2024, any member who has recruited 3 or more new members who met the above requirements will receive a \$25 bonus.

At the end of 2024, any member who has recruited 5 or more new members who met the above requirements will receive a \$50 bonus.

Note, the bonuses cannot be stacked. Any member who is awarded the 5 recruits bonus will not (also) receive the 3 recruit bonus.
