


How about setting up some time to allow the neighborhood kids a chance to run a train on your layout?

# Bring'n'Brag

The October Bring 'n' Brag category was **Non-Revenue (including Cabooses)**. We had six entries in the category, with **Rick Montgomery** taking **first place** for his CSX "Autonomous Geo Car" — a car fitted with solar panels to generate power for its laser measuring device that detects faults in and/or other problems with track geometry (uneven railheads and bumps, misaligned joints, etc.). He explained to us how he saw this interesting car while railfanning, managed to take photos of the prototype from various angles, and then built the model based on his photos, using a red LED to simulate the bottom-mounted laser.

son caboose #35802) and **Mark Vinski** (Millvale Valley caboose kit-bashed from a Santa Fe style "PRR" offset cupola caboose), and **Neal Schorr** brought a photo of one of his Pennsy cabin cars, N5 #47772). All of these models have been weathered and/or have had details applied by the modeler.



In the course of this calendar year, errors have creeped into the monthly standings in the Bring 'n' Brag contest, a point that **Grier Kuehn** raised at the meeting. He kindly volunteered to review and correct the standings on the basis of the monthly BnB reports this year, and he submitted to Dominic and myself the corrected standings, including the points for this month's winners. *Reminder*: Each entrant who places first in the monthly contest earns <u>3 points</u>; for second place they get <u>2 points</u>, and for third place they earn <u>one point</u>. The table below shows the cumulative point totals for the eight contests held this year from January through October 2024; the points earned in the contest at the November meeting will be added to obtain the final standings for 2024 — and awarded at the Jamboree in May 2025. - *Editor* 






# **MEETING TIMETABLE**

### **2024 Incentive Rewards for Recruiting New Members**

For the entire year of 2024, we would like to encourage current members to seek out potential new members at train shows, hobby shops, clubs, or anywhere such candidates might be found. Division Two will reward members for any new members they recruit.

This is how the reward program will work:

- The current member tells the new member about the NMRA's RailPass program and that the division will pay for that RailPass if the following takes place:
- The new member will complete an application on the NMRA website and purchase a RailPass membership (the new member must save his/her receipt).
- The new member comes to a Division 2 meeting in one of the next 3 months that meetings are held.
- The new member is issued a check for the RailPass membership (\$19.99) when their membership is confirmed on the Division's Membership list provided by the Mid-Central Region on the first of each month and they have fulfilled the requirement to attend a Division 2 meeting. Note that if the new member enrolls in any other membership level, we will refund the cost of a RailPass membership.
- The recruiting member is issued a check for \$10.00 when the new member fulfills the requirement to attend a Division 2 meeting.

Since this Incentive Program will run for the full year, we are going to add 2 more incentives for our members.

At the end of 2024, any member who has recruited 3 or more new members who met the above requirements will receive a \$25 bonus.

At the end of 2024, any member who has recruited 5 or more new members who met the above requirements will receive a \$50 bonus.

Note, the bonuses cannot be stacked. Any member who is awarded the 5 recruits bonus will not (also) receive the 3 recruit bonus.

# From the Desk of the Wheeling & Lake Erie Railway, East End by Jimmy Braum

If you are coming to the Division Two meeting this month, consider visiting my layout. For the new members and those who haven't visited yet, I model the modern era Wheeling & Lake Erie Railway from Rook Yard in Greentree, PA to Connellsville, PA. For those who attended the National Narrow Gauge Convention this year, Rook Yard was directly below the hotel.


The prototype WE is known for their collection of older EMD power including SD40-2s, GP35 high hoods, and three of the last Tunnel motors in freight service. The East End of the line is the fifty miles from Rook Yard to the CSX interchange in Connellsville, PA on the old Pittsburgh and West Virginia "High and Dry" line. This stretch of line features dozens of impressive bridges, tunnels, three or more branches, and connections with the Union Railroad, Norfolk Southern, CSXT, and the AVR. While traffic is low compared to class one roads, the line consists of coke from Monessen, some general freight, and LNG tank cars coming from the old Westland mine site, now a natural gas facility.

I use code 100 rail, since in my layout history, the railroad is busier than the real one and requires the heavier rail due to traffic. I have also upgraded my operating system since last year: I now use a Wifitrax system, which is still using an NCE powercab throttle, but I can now operate from my phone using the App "Engine Driver." I also have several functioning hand built switches with hand thrown switch machines. I plan to use a car card system to allow some operation on my layout — after all it is a point to point layout, with some added plausible industry. Like the prototype, I run by track warrant, so no signals and a single track mainline.

You may still be asking yourself, "Why should I visit?" Well, I have made progress since last November's open house. As of this writing (October 2024), the first level features a functional mainline running from wall to wall in my 20' x 25' room. I have also started some small scenery projects, namely Willis Road crossing — a deep cut on the prototype that opens to a blind road crossing. I have installed the beginning of two independent lighting systems for building interior lights. I have placed a few new prototypical buildings and bridges as well as the rough ideas for a few locations. It might also be worth coming to see my late father's HOn3 Rio Grande Southern layout, that he started before he passed away.

I also plan to have most of my custom painted locomotives and rolling stock on display, some of which have won merit awards at Bring 'n' Brag contests.

What am I planning in the future? Well, several projects honestly. In the near future, I am going to start constructing a two track helix, to allow a second deck to be built. This second layout will allow the mainline run to be doubled. I also plan to keep upgrading my Atlas turnouts to FastTracks or Peco turnouts to improve reliability and appearance. While I have about 20+ Wheeling locomotives, I wouldn't rule out adding more locomotives, nor would I rule out adding more tank cars. As with all layouts, more prototypical and realistic buildings are needed, as is scenery work.




I am located about 5-10 minutes from both the Mid-Mon Valley Model Railroad Club layout in New Eagle, and the New Eagle VFD Social Hall (meeting site). The overview map is on page 7, but here is an enlarged map to my house. My hours are from 10am to 1pm before the meeting. So, if you enjoy modern era railroading with vintage locomotives, plan to visit my layout before going to the Division meeting.

522) by the end of the year, a distance of 4000 feet. Work on the older rolling stock continues, as does restoration work on the buildings of the EBT.
