From the Super's Desk

The number of members in our division through 2024 remained the same. We had 200 members at the start of the year and finished with 200 members at the end of the year. That is good news compared to the number of years of declining membership we have experi-

enced. But the news is not as good as it seems. We had 27 members join our division during the year and 27 members that didn't renew their membership during this year. In statistical terms, that's stagnation!

Businesses understand that having to replace lost customers is more expensive than gaining new customers. So it is for organizations like ours.

We tried a recruiting incentive last year that would financially reward any member that recruited a new member and helped them attend 1 division meeting within 3 months of their joining. There was also a financial incentive for the new member to attend. We had no new members recruited by an existing member and no awards were made.

Hmm...

In multiple columns, I have spoken about the benefit of member engagement in our organization. It allows each of us to grow our skills and abilities. That's why the recruiting incentive had the condition to have the new members attend at least 1 meeting. While we are glad to have new members, we're stronger if they engage with us and they will get more value from their membership cost by actively participating instead of simply sending a check to National each year.

Our membership chair, Ken Hanawalt, sends an e-mail to every member who doesn't renew their membership and asks why they didn't renew. Many times, he does not receive any response. But lately, he is frequently hearing that the member wasn't treated warmly or with courtesy at a meeting/event they attended.

Hmm.....

While I'm concerned by this, I'm not prepared to take this information at face value. I think that in general, our members are very cordial and it seems like attendees are interacting and having an enjoyable time. It's also possible that some of the fault may be with the individual that didn't feel welcomed. It happens.

But let's not fail to take action and believe that the fault could only be theirs and not ours. It's unlikely to be that black and white.

Remember that when a new member comes in the door for the first time, he or she is faced with a roomful of people that seem to know each other and what's going on. It takes a lot of guts to jump into conversations, so they often just hang out with themselves. If they feel that no one cares that they came, they may not return (it's tough to be new and ignored).

Remember also that the best way to welcome someone new isn't to tell them about all the great things you've done, but find out what they are interested in. You might be able to introduce them to someone who shares their interest and help them get connected.

If we can just make them feel welcomed and included, it would go a long way to creating a bond that help them join the fun.

We have great members. Let's help new members see that and help them join the fun! We'll all benefit!





Railroad Prototype Modelers – East 2025

The next RPM East convention will be held at the Westmoreland County Community College in Youngwood, PA on <u>Friday</u>, <u>March 21 and Saturday</u>, <u>March 22</u>. This event is sponsored by Division 2 and alternates between western PA in odd years and eastern PA (Malvern) in even years. Other than 2021 it has been featured since the 1990s.

The **Railroad Prototype Modelers** (RPM for short) meets are like a typical NMRA regional convention, but with a couple of differences and some fewer activities, i.e. no non-rail clinics or prototype tours. Thursday evening, March 20, starts with <u>optional operating sessions</u> at nearby layouts. Slots are limited, so preregistration is required. A number of clinics on modeling, railroad history, and prototype equipment are presented on Friday and Saturday. There is a large room to display prototype models (not a contest). In process models are often shown so construction features can be seen and discussed. Everyone is encouraged to bring something to display. In 2023 we had over 500 models. Additionally, there is a large room with high quality vendors such as CMP Shops and Funaro & Camerlengo. This room is shared with various railroad historical societies. So far, we have commitments from Friends of the EBT, NYC System Historical Society, the P&WV Technical & Historical Society, and the B&O Historical Society.

Breaks are provided for lunch and dinner. There is a café in the WCCC building and numerous nearby restaurants in Youngwood, Greensburg, or New Stanton. Registration is a very reasonable: \$40 until February 28, \$45 afterwards. Single day registration is available for \$20. You can pay at the door, although preregistration is encouraged. 


